Reporting Requirements

- The [Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund III \(HEERF III\)](#) is authorized by the American Rescue Plan (ARP), Public Law 117-2, signed into law on March 11, 2021, providing \$39.6 billion in support to institutions of higher education to serve students and ensure learning continues during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Higher education institutions receiving ARP funding must post the following information on its website every calendar quarter.

The first method was to make three-tiered block grants based on the eligible student 2021-2022 FAFSA EFC or self-certification form.</p> <p>In an effort to prioritize students with exceptional need, our grant program provides two buckets of funding for students including funding a three-tiered \$1,750/\$1,500/\$300 "block" awards. Eligible students with an EFC range of 0 - 5,846 (Pell eligible EFC range) received \$1,750 (block 1) and non-Pell Grant eligible students with an EFC range of 5,847 – 15,000 received \$1,500 (block 2). Students with an EFC over 15,000 or who have not completed a 2021-2022 FAFSA will be eligible to self-certify that they have at least \$300 in eligible costs and have financial need. These students will receive \$300 (block 3). All eligible students must be in an ATCC academic program to receive a block grant.</p> <p>The second method was reserved for individual students who certified expenses including food, housing, course materials, technology, and health care in an online ARP emergency grant application.</p> <p>These grants are intended to be used for the cost of attendance or for emergency expenses incurred due to the pandemic, such as tuition, food, housing, or health care, including mental health care.</p>
