

REPORTING OF CARES ACT EMERGENCY GRANTS TO STUDENTS – 03/31/2021

Reporting Requirements

- Section 18004(e) of the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (“CARES Act” or the “Act”), Pub. L. No. 116-136, 134 Stat. 281 (March 27, 2020), directs institutions receiving funds under Section 18004 of the Act to submit (in a time and manner required by the Secretary) a report to the Secretary describing the use of funds distributed from the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (“HEERF”).
- Beginning 30 days after an institution received its student emergency grant funding allocation, each higher education institution must post the following information on its primary web-site.
- The institution must report this information every 45 days thereafter, changed to quarterly reporting beginning on September 30, 2020.
- **This is the final quarterly report covering all remaining HEERF fund expenditures for Section 18004(a)(1) Student Portion Funds.**

The first method was to make awards to all eligible students due to the two-week suspension of courses and the move to all-online instruction caused significant disruption and additional expense to the on-campus student population.</p> <p>The second method is to make awards to identified student groups. An additional supplemental grant was awarded to all Pell eligible students. Supplemental awards are also being awarded to help cover housing and meal costs for students from specific programs who had to return to campus later in the year.</p> <p>A portion of the funding is reserved for individual students who can document increased expenses including food, housing, course materials, technology, and health care in a brief online application location at alextech.edu/cares-act</p>
