CREDITS NEEDED TO GRADUATE

DETAILS:

- Upon verification of eligibility, active military or veterans will be granted up to 20 credits for their military coursework and training.
- Credit determinations were made using current METC curriculum course dates. For questions, please contact the receiving institution for review of your training.
- To earn a degree from one of our Minnesota State colleges or universities, a minimum number of credits must be taken through the institution, typically 30 credits for bachelor's degrees, 15 credits for associate degrees, and 1/3 of the total credits for diplomas and certificates.
 Some programs may vary.
- Additional college credit may be granted for:
 - other military courses with a Joint Service Transcript (JST) or Community College of the Air Force Transcript (CCAF)
 - courses from other colleges/ universities upon review of an official transcript
 - ACE Military Guide recommendations
